### Chateau Lagrange 2023

**Jeb Dunnuck – 95 pts** - A serious and impeccably made wine, the 2023 Château Lagrange is cut from the same cloth as the Les Fiefs yet has more of everything. Pure crème de cassis, graphite, spicy wood, and assorted floral nuances all shine on the nose, and it's medium to full-bodied on the palate, with a layered, graceful mouthfeel and polished tannins. Based on 84% Cabernet Sauvignon and 16% Merlot and aged 21 months in 50% new barrels with the balance in second-fill oak, this is a classic, beautifully done Saint-Julien that will keep for 20-30 years. Tasted multiple times with consistent notes. (March 2026)

**Vinous, Antonio Galloni – 95 pts** - The 2023 Lagrange is just as impressive as it was from barrel. Soaring aromatics meld into a core of brilliant red-toned fruit. This bright, sculpted Saint-Julien delivers on so many levels. In this tasting, it is exceptionally polished, vibrant and expressive. (March 2026)

**James Suckling – 95 pts** - Very good, showing defined minerals and just a touch of sweet spices to the vibrant red and black cherries. Quite bright and precise, with fine, chalky tannins and a long but pristine finish. Such poise, transparency and purity of fruit. Tense, tactile and tightly knit. Certainly nothing heavy here. A blend of 84% cabernet sauvignon and 16% merlot. Drink or hold. (December 2025)

**Jane Ansen – 95 pts** - Classical, well balanced, finessed, this is delivering St Julien typicity, elegance and reserved power, black fruits, tea leaf, crushed rocks, dried herbs, will take its time to fully open but this is going to deliver, and it's easy to recommend. 51hl/ha yield. Tasted twice. (December 2025)

**Robert Parker Wine Advocate, William Kelley – 94 pts** - The 2023 Lagrange has turned out very well in bottle, opening in the glass with notes of cherries, mulberries and violets, framed by nicely integrated new oak. Medium- to full-bodied, rich and layered, with a charming core of fruit, powdery tannins and lively acids, this is a strong effort from this Saint-Julien property. (April 2026)

**Yves Beck – 96 pts** - Les notes de baies rouges, de réglisse et de menthe soulignent la fraîcheur présente, tandis que l'élevage se révèle subtilement avec des notes de bois frais. Compact, le vin est doté de tannins élégants et bien enrobés qui offrent une puissance bien encadrée, tandis que l'acidité est autant structurante que rafraîchissante. Il en résulte un Lagrange précis, harmonieux, sapide et salivant. La dynamique de la finale assure tempérament, expression et persistance. Un vin vibrant et enthousiasmant. (Decembre 2025)
