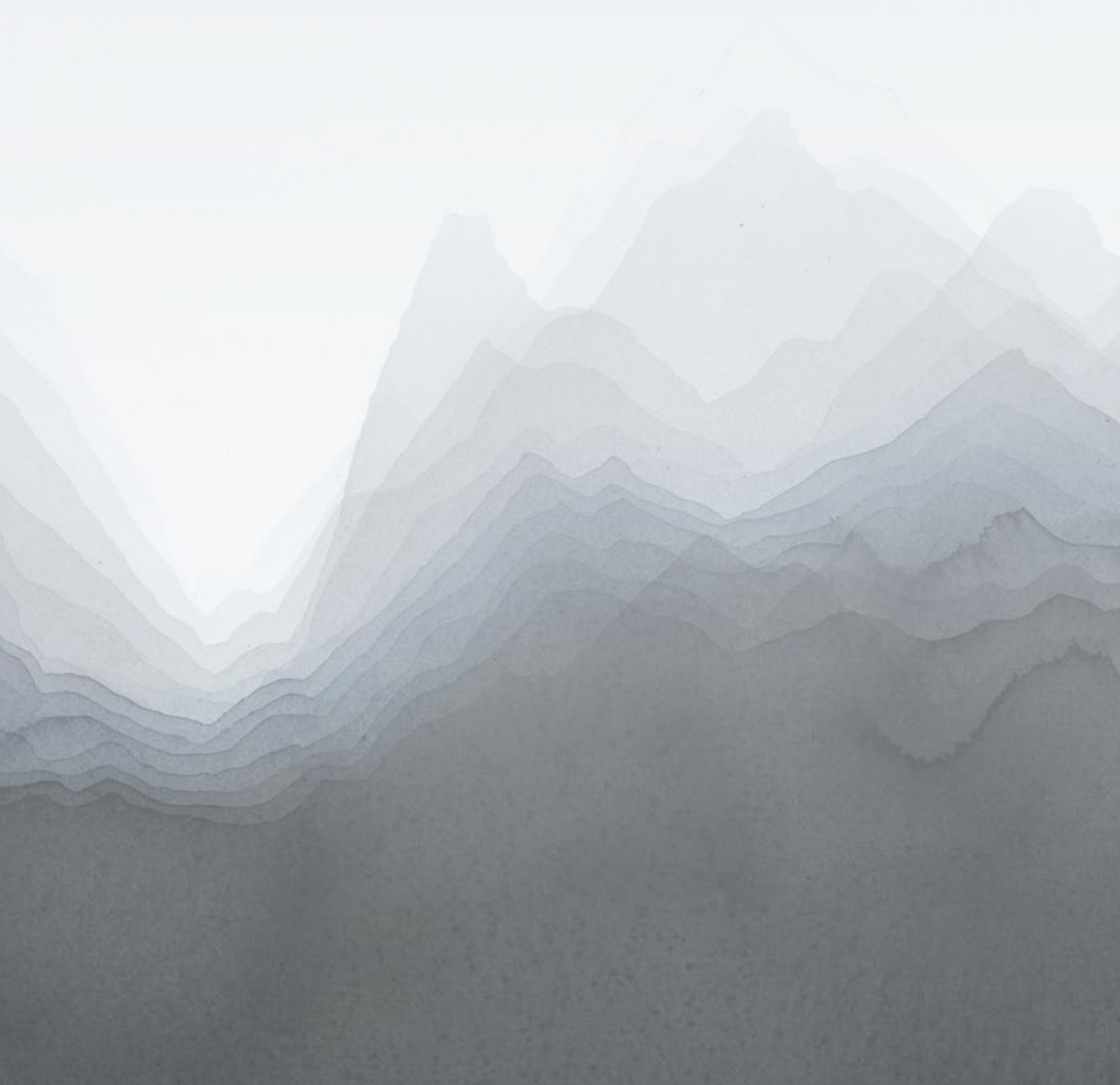

Unlike the other valleys in the Marche region, which follow the rivers that flow toward the sea, the Matelica Valley is nestled in the Apennines running from north to south.

The vineyards in this valley are protected to the east from the elements coming from the sea and to the west by the westerly breezes. The vines climb up the hills on thin, porous, chalky soil where once upon a time there was a salt basin.

This particular microclimate makes the Matelica Valley a unique terroir in the Marche region.





The difference in temperature from night to day is significant: sunny days alternate with the fresh Apennine evenings. This makes for a healthy grapevine, **a mountain grapevine that has never seen the sea, and enriches the grapes with aromas.**

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The exceptional terroir is also particularly well-suited for Verdicchio. This combination gives life to an elegant, fresh wine with a fine bouquet, surprising but not excessive, and unique for its characteristics.

A high altitude wine, enjoyable and distinctive, like the valley it comes from.
